

Welcome to the fourth edition of the Pillusion Film Festival!

All Festival Events will take place at the Pillusion Barn at Heiligkreuz 10, Pill, Tirol, Austria.

The *Opening Reception & Ceremony* will take place at **18:00 on September 3rd**, followed by two screening blocks.

This year's theme is "Contradictions" All films (which have dialogue) will have English and German subtitles.

Our film screenings are organized into blocks. Each block is roughly between 1 and 2 hours long. The blocks are color-coded and numbered consecutively throughout the duration of the festival. Special screenings are noted in green.

Jury awards will be given out in five categories:

- Best Narrative Feature
- Best Documentary Feature
- Best Narrative Short
- Best Documentary Short
- Best Experimental Film

Audience awards will also be given out for the above categories.

At the beginning of each screening block, you will receive voting cards with the names of the films in that block, and a pen. Please, rate the films, and return the voting card before you leave. The voting card collection box is located at the entrance to the barn cinema.

The winners will be announced during the Awards Ceremony on September 6, directly following the special screening at 21:30.

This year, the Winning Films will be screened on September 7th at the BRUX Theater in Innsbruck. The screening will take place in 3 blocks, starting at 17:00.







His focus is on character studies with occasional tendencies towards experimental film or a hybrid of both. Today, Lukas is the Co-Director of the independent BRUX Theater in Innsbruck.
